Bruce Grey Child and Family Services is mandated under legislation to provide services to protect children from abuse and neglect.

Our work is often with families in crisis, providing them with support, education and referral to support services.

We believe that the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility. Through the Our Kids Bruce Grey Foundation, we work closely with the community to provide summer recreation and camp programs for children/youth, as well as children receiving our services in the community.

The success of these efforts is possible through the generosity of people in the community who want to help others.

Volunteers also play a critical and active role in helping us to support families and protect children.

Our volunteers are men and women, young and young-at-heart, single and partnered, working people and retirees. They come from diverse cultural, racial, ethnic and religious backgrounds.

As an organization serving families and children in need, we require all potential volunteers to provide references and undergo a vulnerable sector (police) check.

Our volunteers will follow a code of ethics to ensure a high standard of service for our clients.
